# **September is Library Card Sign-up Month!**

This September, the Lafayette Public Library is joining forces with The Incredibles, the American Library Association and libraries nationwide for Library Card Sign-up Month. This initiative is to remind families, students and people of all ages that signing up for a library card is a great step toward a truly super lifestyle. "The library offers exciting programs, online learning, databases, books, DVDs, music, and more, all free of charge with your library card," says Keith Guidry, Community Relations Coordinator. "There's something for everyone."

As new technologies evolve, libraries continue to lead the way by providing access to digital tools and media, which has become increasingly important in high-poverty areas where students are less likely to have a computer or internet service at home. Students can turn to their public library for materials, programs and knowledgeable library staff that support academic achievement. "A library card offers so many things that a student may not have at home: quiet study rooms, Wi-Fi, and in some cases, a working computer and printer."





# Get a Library Card and Check Out Something Incredible!

The Lafayette Public Library is very excited to announce the addition of two limited-edition library cards for 2018. The public is welcome to visit any branch to sign-up for a commemorative card, featuring "Louisiana Flora" by local artist Cayla Mattea Zeek, or Disney-Pixar's The Incredibles. Both cards will be available throughout the remainder of the year.

Cayla Mattea Zeek graduated from UL Lafayette in 2015 with a degree in painting. Her artwork is characterized by mixed media layering process with watercolor, pen, charcoal, acrylic, and oil on canvas. We had a rocking good summer at the library, and the fun continues even if school is back in session. In July we kicked off our musical instrument lending library at the Chenier Center Branch Library in partnership with the M.I. Brary. We have a collection of 30-plus instruments of all kinds that can be borrowed for 28 days free of charge. This gives patrons a feel for an instrument without a financial commitment. Budding Zydeco stars can borrow a rubboard or a button accordion. If following ukulele star Jake Shimabukuro is your style, we have ukuleles available too.

Following on the heels of our successful gaming programs, we started a lending collection of board games at our regional libraries with funds provided by the Friends of the Library. Now you can checkout *Exploding Kittens* or *Ticket to Ride* among dozens of other games. Maybe you are having a party or family gathering and don't want to spend money on games or would like to try a new game. Check out our wide selection. All of our instruments and board games can be found in the online catalog by searching either Musical Instrument or Board Game.

Of course, to check out you need a library card, so take the opportunity to be part of library card sign-up month. The sign up process is simple, and we will have two special limited edition cards for you to choose from starting September 1st.

**New to You: Library Museum Pass!** 

The Hilliard University Art Museum and the Lafayette Public Library System are thrilled to announce a partnership that allows members of the community to check out a free, one-time-use family admission pass. The pass is good for one week and provides an entire household access to enjoy all the museum has to offer. The passes are currently available to anyone with a valid Lafayette Public Library card to check out from one of our nine library locations.

Jolie Johnson, the museum's marketing manager stated that this program directly aligns with the museum's mission and vision. "One of the museum's major goals is to increase accessibility of our galleries and services. This partnership allows us to reach an audience that may not visit the museum otherwise. It removes the barrier of cost and provides visitors with activities to explore and talk with one another about art. Sometimes people feel they don't belong here because they don't understand art. But we truly believe there is no wrong way to interpret a piece. Our experiences, backgrounds, and interests influence the way we perceive the world; it's the same for viewing art."



The Hilliard University Art Museum is located at 710 East Saint Mary Boulevard, on the campus of University of Louisiana at Lafayette. Museum Hours are: Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday, 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM; Wednesday, 9:00 AM to 8:00 PM; Saturday, 10:00 AM to 5:00 PM; closed Sunday and Monday. # **Check Out the M.I.Brary and Make Some Noise**

At the library, our mission is to enrich the lives of our patrons. Over the years, we have expanded our services from books and educational programs to include movies, games, museum passes, and even air quality monitors! Now, we are proud to support our local music scene by providing instruments through our new Musical Instrument Library or "M.I.Brary."

If you are unfamiliar with the 24 Hour Citizen Project, it is an annual event connecting people who have community-focused ideas with expertise and financial backers to make their dreams happen. In July 2017, Dr. Ryan Cazares formed a team to help him pitch this one-of-a-kind idea to a panel of investors. "Imagine," he said, "if there's a Grammy Award winner sitting right here with us, but they don't even know it because they don't have the money to purchase an instrument." With that, the team was granted start-up funds to stock up on an assortment of instruments to be enjoyed, free of charge, by members of the local community.

We are thrilled to support this project through the Lafayette Public Library. In the words of library director Teresa Elberson, "We jumped in to help Ryan's dream become reality because we're in the business of circulating things. It doesn't matter if it's books or

instruments." If you have ever wanted to try your hand at playing the guitar, keyboard, or even the accordion, this is your chance.

The M.I.Brary allows eligible patrons with a library card in good standing to check out one of these instruments at our musicallythemed Clifton Chenier Branch. Musical Instrument Library services are available every Monday through Thursday, 1:00 - 7:00 PM, and Friday, 1:00 – 6:00 PM.

Checking out M.I.Brary instruments is slightly different than checking out conventional materials. A patron must be 16 or older in order to qualify; checkouts last for a full 28 days and cannot be renewed; and there is a limit of one instrument per card at a time. Holds are not available on these items; however, patrons can check availability at any time using our online catalog or by calling the Chenier Branch at 291-2941.





# What is an "Arduino?"

An Arduino is a very simple computer system used for creating electronics projects. It relies on a physical circuit board, or "microcontroller," as well as an IDE (Integrated Development Environment) that runs on your computer. The IDE allows you to write an upload code on a computer system, then upload that code to the physical board.

The Arduino is an incredibly popular tool for starter electronics projects because of its simplicity and versatility. Additionally, the Arduino IDE uses a variant of C++, a very common programming language, which makes it more approachable than other systems.

When combined with LEDs and the right sensors, you can create an impressive array of cool toys, gadgets, and even practical devices for use around your home. We have several kits available at the library to practice with, and you can sign up for our Arduino Basics workshop. Independent learners are more than welcome to visit the Makerspace during open access hours and see what they can develop on their own!

Every year, the American Library Association's (ALA) Office for Intellectual Freedom (OIF) publishes statistics about censorship attempts in U.S. schools and libraries, compiled from public challenges in the news and confidential reports submitted to the office. Usually these threats target literature, but they sometimes venture beyond books, affecting DVDs, databases, displays, and art exhibits.

September 23 - 29 is National "Banned Books" week. Here are a few YA genre selections from the ALA's list of the top 10 "Most Challenged" books of 2017. WARNING: These books have been challenged for their DANGEROUS and UPSETTING content and should not be read under any circumstance.

# The Hate U Give by Angie Thomas

The sole witness to a homicide, Starr must testify before a grand jury that will decide whether to indict the cop, and she's terrified, especially as emotions run high.

Despite winning multiple awards and being the most searched-for book on Goodreads during its debut year, this YA novel was challenged and banned in school libraries and curriculums because it was considered "pervasively vulgar" and because of drug use, profanity, and offensive language.





# Th1rteen R3asons Why by Jay Asher

Clay Jensen doesn't want anything to do with the tapes Hannah Baker made. Hannah is dead. Her secrets should be buried with her. Then Hannah's voice tells Clay that his name is on her tapes - and that he is, in some way, responsible for her death.

Originally published in 2007, this New York Times bestseller has resurfaced as a controversial book after Netflix aired a TV series by the same name. This YA novel was challenged and banned in multiple school districts because it

# Author Dinner to Feature South Louisiana Native Ken Wells

This year, Friends of the Lafayette Public Library will honor South Louisiana native, Ken Wells, at their Author Dinner. Wells is a novelist, longtime Wall Street Journal writer and Pulitzer Prize finalist; additionally, he is a storyteller, photographer and musician. The late Tom Wolfe has referred to Ken Wells as the "Cajun Carl Hiaasen."

Besides his celebrated career as a journalist and war correspondent, Wells is the author of many fiction and nonfiction books. His Catahoula Bayou Trilogy includes Meely LaBauve, Junior's Leg and Logan's Storm. Wells' nonfiction titles include Travels with Barley: the Quest for the Perfect Beer Joint, The Good Pirates of the Forgotten Bayous: Fighting to Save A Way of Life in the Wake of Hurricane Katrina, Floating Off the Page/Herd on the Street/Collections from the Wall Street Journal and Herd on the Street: Animal Stories from the Wallstreet Journal.




Additionally, he has published Crawfish Mountain and a young

adult book titled Rascal, A Dog and His Boy. In 2004, he collaborated with his brother, Pershing, to write and produce a music album called *Crawdiddy*. Wells is working on a new book centered on the cultural history of gumbo called *Gumbo Life: Tales from the Roux* Bayou, and the Wells Brothers are at work on a second studio album called Bayou Black. 

# Confused About Membership Renewals? This Should Help....


