





Rheta Grimsley Johnson to Speak at **Annual Author Dinner**

We are in for a treat at this year's annual Author Dinner, to be held Thursday, October 30 at the Petroleum Club of Lafayette. Award-winning author and syndicated columnist Rheta Grimsley Johnson will speak and the 2014-15 Friend of the Year will be announced.

As a reporter for United Press International, the Commercial Appeal (Memphis), the Atlanta Journal-Constitution and numerous other regional newspapers, Johnson earned several awards, including the Ernie Pyle Memorial Award for human interest reporting, the Headliner Award for commentary and the American Society of Newspaper Editors' Distinguished Writing Award for commentary. In 1986, she was inducted into the Scripps Howard Newspapers Editorial Hall of Fame. Today, her column appears in approximately fifty newspapers nationwide.

A native of Colquitt, Georgia, Johnson grew up in Montgomery, Alabama, studied journalism at Auburn University and has lived and worked in the South all of her career. She now splits her time between Mississippi, Colorado and Henderson, LA. Her books include Poor Man's Provence, Hank Hung the Moon and Enchanted Evening Barbie and the Second Coming.



Johnson will be signing her books at the event, which will start with a social at 6:30 p.m., followed by dinner at 7 p.m. Admission is \$25 per person and reservations can be made by calling (337) 984-8661. The reservation deadline is Tuesday, October 28 at noon.


Friends Fund Technology at SRL

Thanks to the Friends of the Library, the South Regional Library now has new technology to offer patrons and improve their library experience. The Friends funded the library's new SPARK Lab makerspace, in which patrons can learn about 3D design and even try out a 3D printer. The Friends also helped (along with the Lafayette Breakfast Sertoma Club and the Lafayette Sertoma Club) to bring a hearing loop system to SRL's meeting room. This innovative system allows patrons with hearing loss to wirelessly connect their hearing aids to the room's PA system.

The Friends are gearing up for another book sale in September. Friends Night is Wednesday, September 10 from 6 to 8 p.m. The sale continues Thursday through Saturday and, as usual, we have lots of books to sell! The inventory count will not be done until after the deadline for this newsletter, but we will have at least as many books as in previous sales. We usually move between 500 and 600 boxes for the sale. Come early to get the best selection, then come back on Saturday for our clearance sales!

Our Spring sale was very successful, thanks to all who shopped and volunteered. We recorded the second highest total sales since moving to the Heymann Center, and our Wednesday night and Saturday figures were the highest of any year. Our deepest thanks to the staff at the Heymann Center for all their hard work, and to the Lafayette Parish Sheriff's Office for supplying us with the labor necessary to move the books from our warehouse. Thanks also to Chevron for sponsoring our banner, Target for bags, UPS Store #1994 on Johnston for boxes and to Coca Cola for the use of their shells. The sale happens because of a group effort of many people. We would especially like to thank the staff at the warehouse for help above and beyond the call of duty. To date, we have been able to contribute \$669,626.16 to the library, all of which is earned by the book sales.




Don't Forget the Silent Auction




