

I love the local "Shop Lafayette" and "Eat Lafayette" campaigns that encourage our community to support local businesses. So why not "Read Lafayette?" Everything our library system does centers around encouraging everyone to read and use local library resources. Shopping and eating cost you money, but checking out something to read from the library, downloading a library book from home or using any of our resources is free to everyone in the community.

We are just like any other community brick and mortar institution, always on the hunt for new users and supporters. Our community changes constantly as people move into and out of the area. And whether you have lived here for years or just came to Lafayette, our library system strives to keep things new and exciting. We offer something for everyone, whether you are a toddler, teen, young professional, busy parent or retiree.

In April, we celebrate National Library Week (April 9-15), recognizing the contributions of our nation's libraries and librarians. Our parish library system is recognized at the national level for having strong community financial support in an area that embraces library use. We issued more than 13,000 new library

cards and circulated over 1,770,000 items in the last fiscal year, with 30% of those items being children's books.

We are already gearing up for a terrific summer of reading and programs for all ages. We have summer reading programs for children, teens and adults, and we kick them all off with a super, day-long event at the Main Library on Saturday, June 3. We hope you'll join us!

And between shopping and dining, remember to also "Read Lafayette," and visit your local library to see what we have for you.—Teresa Elberson



And in those days of old, books were priced individually. Yes, that is correct. Each book was examined and priced by the sorter, something that could never happen with the volume of books we have today.

In the mid eighties, when Carol and Jack Tuft were responsible for the sales, the board determined that we needed to change that method and by-the-inch was born. (As an aside, consideration was also given to books by weight, but that idea was soon discarded.)

So now at our sales, books are measured and totaled easily. As an "oldie", I am so glad we decided on this method which makes our job a bit easier.

Donation News, or How to Fill a Bin

The Friends are so grateful for all the donations we receive each week. The book sale would not happen without the generosity of our donors. With donation bins available from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. each weekday, we are fortunate to have so much material for our sales.

We would like to remind our donors that there are some types of materials we CANNOT accept.

Magazines, textbooks, encyclopedias and VHS tapes cannot be resold. Outdated books, such as travel guides, medical books and computer books printed before 2012 also cannot be accepted. We ask that you consider donating these materials elsewhere, as we have no other choice but to dispose of them.

Please be sure to donate only books and other materials that are "gently used." As a rule of thumb, if you would not want them in your house because they are moldy, dirty, etc., we cannot use them either.

Thanks again for all of your donations. They keep our sales going each year.
