Director's Message



Coming Soon: RFID (Radio Frequency Identification)

After a very long wait for our patrons and staff, we hope to have new state-of-the-art self-check stations in place at all regional library locations after the first of the year. What does that mean for our patrons? You will be able to checkout your library materials without staff assistance. The new system reads stacks of items instead of individual barcodes, reducing the steps in the checkout process and making checkout faster.

Staff will still be there to assist you, or they can checkout your materials with their own new equipment. Either way, it should reduce time spent waiting in a checkout line. This new technology also allows us to check in items just as fast. We started the process of converting all the item data into the new RFID system in October and hope to have everything ready to go after the first of the year. New library item security is also linked to the checkout process. Our new touch screen self-check stations should provide one-stop convenience for our patrons by integrating information on events and the on-line catalog all in one checkout display.

New to You: Lafayette Parish Public School IDs now serve as Public Library Cards

The Lafayette Parish School System and the Lafayette Public Library have teamed up this year to provide public school students with a free Student ID-Public Library Card. This program automatically enrolls more than 31,000 Lafayette Parish public school students into the library system.

Students can now use their school IDs at the public library to check out books, DVDs, audiobooks, and games in addition to accessing online databases through the library's website. Best of all, there are NO overdue fees on any late item the student has checked out. They will get a reminder email as the due date gets closer, but overdue fees are not charged, and items renew automatically if not returned by the due date.



Here are some of the online resourses and databases that the Lafayette Public Library offers to students:

- Your child can get free homework help online (24/7) by using our statewide resource **Homework Louisiana**. Visit **homeworkla.org/ Lafayette** to get started.
- Your child can download books, audiobooks, and magazines free to any mobile device or computer by using easy-to-use download services such as **Libby, by OverDrive** or **Flipster**.
- Your child can enjoy reading, listening, and learning with our popular student resources like **TumbleBooks**, **TrueFlix**, or **ScienceFlix**. One of our newest resources is **Lynda.com** with hundreds of online tutorials.

Introducing the BiblioBike

Our New Pedal-Powered Mobile Library!

The Lafayette Public Library (LPL) is debuting its new pedal-powered mobile on wheels library — the BiblioBike! This eco-friendly tricycle brings library resources in a new and exciting way to public venues in the community. As a new point of service engagement tool, it gives the library the agility to bring library services to places where locals tend to congregate, such as festivals, parades, playgrounds, and other locations.

The BiblioBike is stocked with library resources such as books, program information, and library cards. Its onboard collection of materials and information can be tailored to fit the needs of any outreach opportunity and community event that the bike visits. Equipped with a Wi-Fi hotspot, it provides instant access to free ebooks, online resources, and databases.

Book bikes have been around since 2008. The first book bike was the creation of Gabriel Levinson of Chicago, IL. He would ride his custombuilt Haley book tricycle through Chicago parks handing out free books to residents. In 2010, the Chicago Public Library (CPL) formed a partnership with Levinson, and the book bike became an official CPL library service.

The BiblioBike has been made possible by the Friends of the Lafayette Public Library. It is masterfully wrapped in the art of Cayla Mattea Zeek, a local artist that recently designed the 2018 limited-edition library art card that is being offered at all nine branches. Inspired by Louisiana landscapes and scenes using local flora and fauna, the artist states, "I wanted to use wildlife specific to our region, with little books planted within the scenery."

The new mini-library on wheels promotes both literacy and physical fitness. It will serve the community in a new and exciting way, reaching patrons where they least expect it. As with the upcoming electric car charging stations that are being installed at the West Regional Library in Scott, the BiblioBike encourages sustainability.




